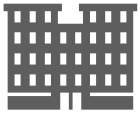
SC Ranks 7th in Home Foreclosures.

1 in every 5,331 homes went into foreclosure in 2021

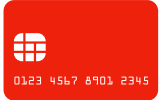


SC Ranks 5th in the nation for Student Loan Debt.

SC has a 25.7% eviction rate - the highest in the nation.



SC has one of the highest debt-to-income ratios in the country.
